

## Grey literature cited in scientific articles: case study at the Faculty of Education, University of Ljubljana, Slovenia






## **BACKGROUND**

One of the main tasks of an academic library is to support researchers and the research work at the faculty, which requires knowledge of the evolving information needs of researchers and their information behaviour in everyday work.

In order to develop better services for research support, acquisition and management of library's collections, our study wishes to understand what kind of information resources researchers at the Faculty of Education cite in their published scientific papers and to what extent they cite grey literature.






## **CONCLUSIONS**

Overall percentage of GL in our sample of articles from the field of Education is 13,5 %. The most common sources are conference proceedings, reports, theses, syllabuses and legislation.

We have identified interesting examples of grey literature that are typical for the researchers from the Education field and showed some

potential differences in the use of grey literature between different departments and disciplines within the field of Education.
