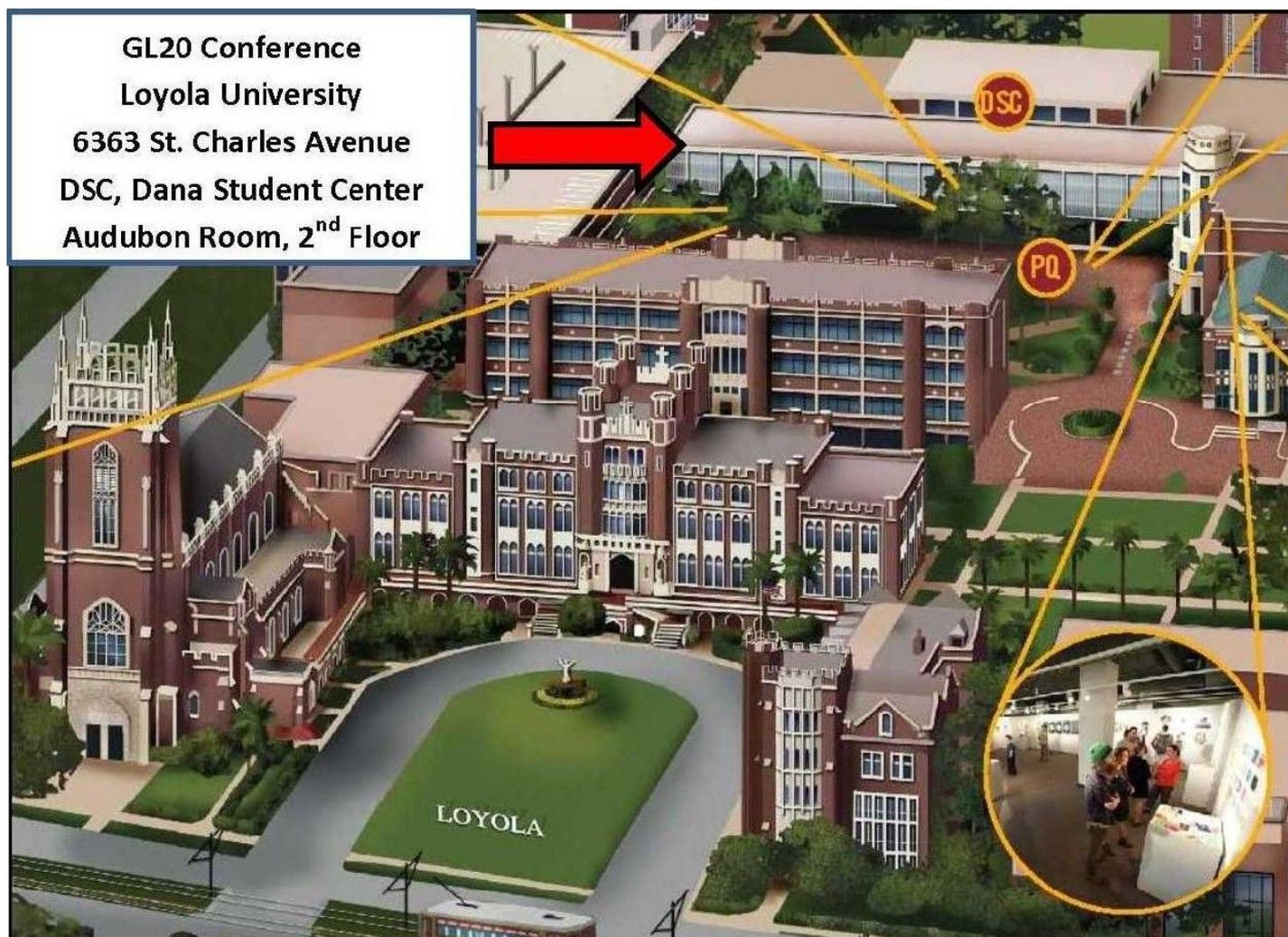
Judith C. Russell
